PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low income families who are currently known to be eligible for FSM (Free School Meals) and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. From 2012-13, it was expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSM within the last 6 years. This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially, and it is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent.

At St Mary Abbots School the Pupil Premium Allocation for last year and this academic year are as follows:

Academic Year	Pupil Premium Allocation

2020-2021	£33,416

The Pupil Premium money is used to ensure all FSM children and LAC children are supported in making good progress. This is carefully monitored and tracked so as to ensure that the majority of pupils reach Age Related Expectations (ARE) in Reading, Writing and Maths by the end of Key Stage 2. The school can demonstrate evidence in each year group that the gap between pupil premium pupils and non-pupil premium pupils has been narrowed.

The school has allocated the funding to provide full time Teaching Assistant support in Year 1 and Year 2 and Teaching Assistant support throughout Key Stage 2 with core learning. The funding is also used to provide additional intervention support from Teaching Assistants e.g. to read with children regularly.

In the academic year 2019/2020, there were 20 children being supported in class using the Pupil Premium funding. In the academic year 2020/2021 we again have 20 children eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant.

The progress of these pupils is tracked termly by the Senior Leadership Team.
