



## St Mary Abbots School

### Sports Premium Evaluation 2021-22

In order to evaluate last year's plan, we have RAG rated the overarching objectives and impact statements below.

At St Mary Abbots we used our Sports Premium funding last year (£17,645) in the following ways:

- To provide all of our children across the school with specialist PE coaching, on a weekly basis
- To purchase resources to support quality delivery of PE within the school
- To provide access to sporting competitions

During the 2021-22 academic year, our Sports Premium spending was as follows:

| <b>Specialist PE coaching</b>        | <b>£10,000</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children across the school benefited from specialist teaching from a PE coach, on a weekly basis (team teaching with a range of staff from across the school in order to provide CPD). Staff reported that their PE subject knowledge improved through this CPD</li> <li>• PE coach ensured a clear progression of units and skills across year groups</li> <li>• The children enjoyed a broad PE curriculum, encompassing a range of sports that non-specialist staff may feel less confident to teach alone</li> <li>• Skill level e.g. ball skills and coordination in individual sports has improved, alongside improved physical fitness post pandemic</li> <li>• Pupils showed good cooperation with peers and reported that they enjoyed team games</li> <li>• Confidence and self-esteem have increased, particularly so for some children</li> <li>• Pupils value and see the importance of exercise for better health</li> <li>• Staff reported the benefit to the children's mental health of these predominantly outdoor sessions with our specialist coach</li> </ul> |
| <b>Resources &amp; competitions</b>  | <b>£2,645</b>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The school invested in a range of sports equipment to enhance existing resources</li> <li>• PE coach reports that he is now better resourced to deliver quality PE sessions across sporting disciplines and year groups</li> <li>• Pupil engagement in PE sessions has improved</li> <li>• A range of children in Years 5 and 6 accessed borough level sporting competitions – feedback from these children was highly positive</li> </ul>   |
| <b>Swimming &amp; transportation</b> | <b>£5000</b>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All children in Year 3 accessed weekly swimming lessons with specialist swimming instructors</li> <li>• Children developed their ability to swim to at least 25m, their knowledge of various strokes and awareness of water safety</li> <li>• Staff reported the positive impact that this activity had on children's well-being</li> </ul>  |
