Dear Class 5,

Happy New Year! I hope you all had a wonderful break, filled with lots fun and chance to rest!

This term we will be starting a new Geography topic-Sow, Grow Farm. This topic focuses on understanding how different types of farming impact our planet, across different climates. We will explore the impact of deforestation, with particular focus on the Amazon rainforest.

In Science, we will be learning to describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, and insect and a bird. We will describe the life process in some plants including how plants reproduce. We will learn about the gestation period of mammals including humans, how humans age over time including how the body changes during puberty and aging. Some key vocabulary your children will learn includes cataract, foetus, gestation, process and stage. Please see attached knowledge organiser.
